

PROWORDS

Prowords are pronounceable words or phrases that have been assigned standard meanings for the purpose of expediting message handling. ARRL publications describe a wide variety of such words. Operators should familiarize themselves with the ARRL terms and every effort should be made for clarity and uniformity of transmissions. Common terms are listed here for convenience.

<u>Proword</u>	<u>Explanation</u>
ALL AFTER	The part of the message to which I have reference is all that which follows _____.
ALL BEFORE	The part of the message to which I have reference is all that which precedes _____.
BREAK	I hereby indicate the separation of the text from other parts of the message.
CORRECTION	An error has been made in this transmission. The correct version follows.
DISREGARD	This transmission is in error. Disregard it.
FIGURES	Numerals follow.
FLASH	Ahead of all other messages. Interrupt messages with lower precedence.
I SAY AGAIN	I am repeating transmission or part.
I SPELL	I shall spell phonetically the next part.
OUT	This is the end of my transmission to you and no answer is required or expected.
OVER	This is the end of my transmission to you and a response is required or expected.
RELAY	Transmit this message to those addressed.
ROGER	I have received your last transmission satisfactorily. The CW equivalent is QSL.
SAY AGAIN	Repeat all of your last transmission.

SILENCE,
SILENCE,
SILENCE

Cease transmission immediately. Silence will be maintained until instructed to resume

SILENCE
LIFTED

Resume normal transmission. Silence can be lifted only by the station imposing it or higher authority.

SPEAK
SLOWER

Your transmission is at too fast. Reduce speed of transmission.

CORRECT

You are correct or what you have transmitted is correct.

WORDS TWICE

Communication is difficult. Transmit (ting) each phrase (words or code group) twice.

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
